First day of contest fired off with official opening by the head of the Institute of Computer Science Assoc. Prof. Semanišin. He said some quick words about our faculty and tradition of studying computer science at our Institute. He also presented possibilities for scientific research. He stated that our Institute has many experiences with student's programming contests, such as Palma and OI. After his speech we gave him some questions concerning the contest:

### What do you think about quality of this kind of competitions?

Since there was no competition yet, I can't tell anything about the quality of

contestants, but all of the competitors were chosen in regional rounds, so they must be one of the best. Also I saw one of my former graduants on the last year's winners list, he was from Jagiellonian University and he was considered as one of the most experienced students.

### The contest last for seven days, but only two days are reserved for the main competition. What is your opinion on this?

This competition shouldn't have got only technical, but also social and cultural aspects. Although the participants are very well developed in the field of computer science, they are in the phase of life, where they should learn new facts about foreign countries and people. Also several hours of programming contest can be pretty difficult in terms of psychical and physical condition, so it is necessary to have some time off to refresh themselves. I hope that at the end of the CEOI they will remember not only solving difficult problems and competing but also promote Slovakia and UPJS.

### What advantages do you see in these kinds of competitions?

We organize a lot of events of this kind, even though most of the people doesn't have organizing CEOI in their scope of employment. We always want to create opportunities for self-starters who are talented in the field of informatics. It is also good experience for people who organize this event and I hope they will take advantage from it in the future.
